Screening Questions

1.Ask Potential Home:

A- The signs/causes of horse medical Emergencies such as: Colic, Founder/Laminitis and how the potential new adopter would respond. (Colic should be well known by the applicant and how to address this emergency.)	A
B- Adopter to confirm they are willing to sign and abide by a contract if approved.	B
C- What is the size of the fenced property where the horse will be living, and how many horses will be in that area.	C
D- To describe the provided shelter and the fencing of the area the horse will be kept.	D
F- The amount and type of feed, provided to the horse and how often.	F

2. Asks the following to the applicant's veterinarian:

A- How long have they cared for the potential new adopter's horses? (It is of concern if it has been less than two years, or if they see the horse less than twice a year.)	A
B - How would they describe the potential new adopter's level of horse handling experience - Rate on a scale of 1-5, 5 being excellent (3 or lower requiring further explanation.)	B
C- How would they describe the potential new adopter's current horse's condition on the Henneke scale 1-7.(Should be 5.)	C
D - Does the potential new adopter keep up to date with regular vaccines and care, and do they contact for emergencies when appropriate?	D
E -Do you feel like the location is safe, and can accommodate another horse?	E.
F - Have you ever had any issues with payment?	F
G - Generally, are they the same horses you care for or do you see horses come and go from the owner's care?	G
H- Are you aware of any abuse or neglect of animals?	H
I-Would you give them your horse?	l

3. Asks the following to the applicant's farrier:

A- How long have they worked with the potential new adopter's horses, and how often do they trim/shoe for the applicant?	A
B- Describe the adequacy of the location the potential new adopter keeps any current horse/s. Ex; Fencing safe, no debris laying around, adequate shelter, large enough for the number of horses?	B
C- Describe the potential new adopter's horse- handling abilities. Rate on a scale of 1-5 (3 or lower requiring further explanation.)	C
D- Has the potential new adopter's mentioned what they want to do with the new horse?	D
E-Have you ever had an issues with payment? Generally, are they the same horses you care for or do you see horses come and go from the owner's care? Are you aware of any abuse or neglect of animals? Would you give them your horse?	E
F- If you needed a home for your horse, would you give it to them?	F

4. Asks the following to the applicant's trainer:

A- How long have you trained the potential new adopter?	A
B- Describe the potential new adopter's horse handling abilities on a scale from 1-5 (3 requiring further explanation)	B
C-Describe the potential adopters horse riding abilities on a scale from 1-5 (3 requiring further explanation)	C
D- What are your primary riding disciplines?	D
E- What will the potential new adopter's horse be used for?	E

5.Asks the following to the applicant's personal reference:

A- How long have you known the potential new adopter, and in what capacity.	A
B- Describe the potential new adopter's horse handling experience.(If reference is a knowledgeable horse handler) Rate on a scale of 1-5 with 3 or lower requiring further explanation.	B
C- Describe where the potential new adopter keeps their horses Ex; Fencing, Shelter, Etc.	C
D- Has the potential new adopter had horses before? If so, what happened to them?	D
E- Do you know what the potential new adopter's plans to use the horse for.	E
F- How would you rate the potential new adopter's care of their animals from 1-5?	F
G- Do you have any concerns about the safety of the animals on their property. Are you aware of any abuse or neglect?	G
H- If you needed a home for your horse, Would you give it to them?	H

6.Asks the following to the applicant's neighbor reference:

A- How close do you live to the potential new adopter, and how many years have they lived there?	A
B- Does the potential new adopter have animals on their property? Can you see them from your home?	B
C- How would you rate the care of their animals? Please rate on a scale of 1-5, (3 or lower require further explanation)	C
D- Do you have any concerns about the safety of the animals on their property? Are you aware of any abuse or neglect?	D
E- Have any animals been removed from the property by authorities?	E
F -Are the animals long term residents or does the applicant have different animals regularly?	F
G- Do you know if they lease, rent, or own the property?	G

7. Asks the following to the applicant's boarding facility:

A- How many acres are fenced?	A
B- Describe the shelter and fencing of the facility.	B
C- If full boarding, what hay and grain do you use?	C
D- If full board, how are the horses watered and how often is it checked?	D
E- If the potential new adopter is a current border, how would you rate their horse handling ability on a Scale 1-5?	E
F- Do you own or lease the facility, if facility is leased get the name of the owner.	F
G- Will they sign a lien release agreeing that: In the event of delinquency of payment by the potential new adopter, no lien shall be placed on the horse by the barn. The barn should contact the Adoptee who will take the horse back.	G
